

Learning Mentors

This has been a busy year for the Learning Mentor Team. We have participated in a wide variety of projects and we have also run some new projects in school.

In the Autumn Term, some of the children form Year 3 took part in an afterschool 'Rainbow' club. Each week the children completed a different activity ranging from art and crafts to

cooking to playing games. In the Spring Term, Year 2 took part in a 'Talking Homework' project. Run over 6 weeks, the project aimed to promote reading especially at home. At the end project, the children and their parents visited the Library of Birmingham.

The Summer Term saw School Council and some of our Prefects taking part in the Junior Traffic Warden Scheme. On a weekly basis, children went out to speak to Parents/Carers about the importance of parking safely around school.

In school, we have run some very exciting projects for children. In Year 4, a group of girls have taken part in a 'This Girl Can' project that run alongside the 'This Girl Can' campaign, to empower them. We have also been involved in Family Learning, running Transition projects across the School and trialling a new emotional resilience project.









Year One have had a great year this year. We've been so busy visiting Blakesley Hall, creating our own houses and growing plants. However, our favourite time this year was the delivery of the chicks.

yr 4 science

We carried out an experiment whereby yeast, warm water, and sugar were added to a plastic bottle, followed by an unused balloon placed over the top of the bottle. When the yeast and sugar dissolved into the water, it produced carbon dioxide, and subsequently blew up the balloon as the gas rose up into the balloon. It's a similar process when yeast is added to dough to make bread rise.
