Did you know that our school attendance has been below national average for a number of years?


Did you know that our persistent absence is above national average? The national average for attendance is 95.8%. The national average for persistent absence is 9.6%

Currently whole school attendance is 94.2%. Currently whole school persistent absence is 16.1%

We are extremely pleased by the progress we are making towards national for whole school attendance. Thanks you for your continued support with this.

However, our persistent absence is extremely high this is largely as a result of term time leave. The fining process is being implemented to tackle this area for development.


