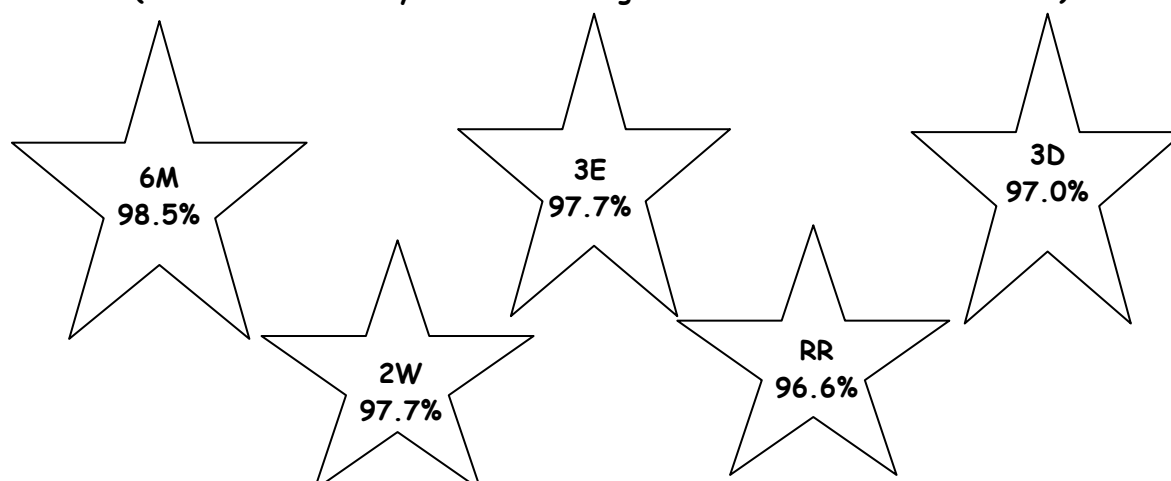

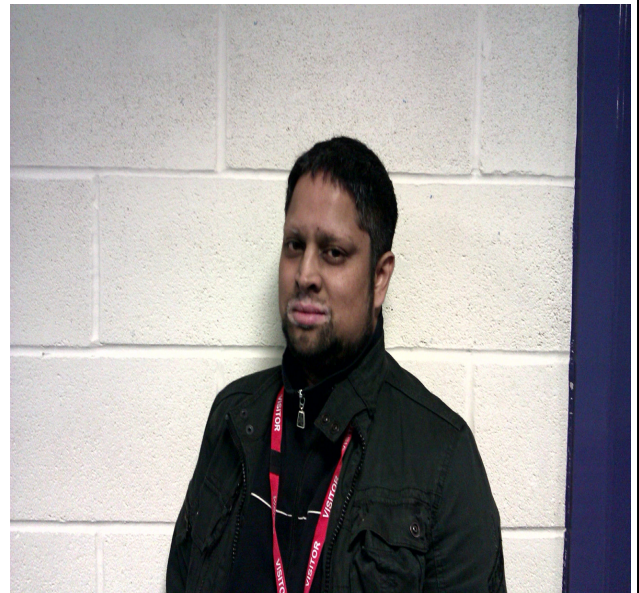
Parent Governor—Abdul Aziz

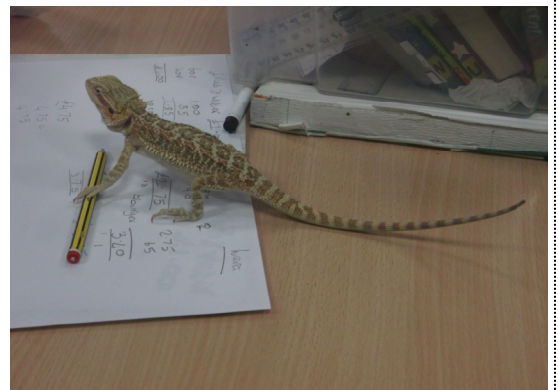


The KS1 disco last Friday was a great success. The school managed to raise £91.45 for Birmingham Children's Hospital.

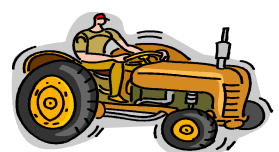

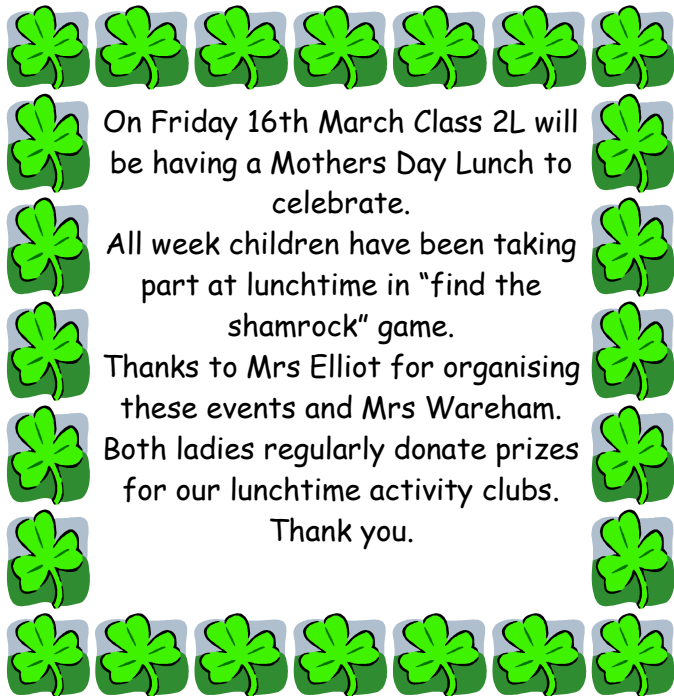
All the children from Reception to year 6 are having hands-on experience about the world of work and hearing stories about how to make sure they can achieve their own dream for their future.
