We had a look at a real bomb that was used in the war, and saw the old Cathedral that had been partly destroyed. It was an excellent day and the children learnt a lot of new things about the war.

## YEAR 5 TRIP

On Friday 20<sup>th</sup> October, Year 6 visited the National Memorial Arboretum in Alrewas. We learned all about what life was like as an evacuee in the Second World War and read lots of different diary entries and letters from children who were evacuated. In the afternoon, we had a guided tour of the grounds and even took part in a special act of remembrance. The weather was beautiful and we have all taken home some special memories of the day!

#### EMERGENCY CONTACTS-
