

Number Day is here soon! So here are some counting tips for you to practise lots of counting at home, on your journey to school **NSPCC** or anywhere!



Year Group	
Reception	Practise counting numbers to 20 using objects and drawings.
Year 1	Practise counting to 20 and beyond
Year 2	Practise counting in 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s
Year 3	Practise counting in 4s, 8s, 50s and 100s
Year 4	Practise counting in 6s, 7s, 9s, 11s and 12s
Year 5	Practise all times tables up to 12 x 12
	Know all the square numbers up to 12×12 .
Year 6	Practise all times tables up to 12×12
	Practise counting in decimals e.g. 0.1, 0.2, 0.3 etc.
	2.5, 5, 7.5, 10 etc.

Challenge! Can your child count backwards?

One simple way of supporting your child to count in different ways is to use sport. For example you could be playing catch with your child and every time they catch the ball they have to tell you a number.




New Books
