Well done to 5C and 3K who are already at national target for attendance, Keep it up! A huge congratulations to the 103 pupils who have excellent attendance, they have been here every single day since September!

Did you know, 17% children have attendance of less than 90%. Unfortunately, persistent absence (attendance of 90% or less) is still having a huge impact on our whole school attendance. As a result, we have started the process of fining families when pupils are persistently absent. This year so far **two** of our families have been taken to court and will receive a Penalty Notice and have to pay a fine. Please be aware that should you choose to allow your child's attendance to fall below 90% each parent could receive a fine.
