Medicine

There may be times when your child needs to take medicine at school. All medication must be prescribed, except for antihistamines (allergy medication). The school will only administer medicine that needs to be taken four times a day or has a specific time indicated on the label. Parents must complete and sign medicine forms, which are

available in the main office.

<u>Uniform</u>

Our school uniform consists of:

- Grey or black trousers or skirt
- White or blue shirt or polo shirt
- Navy jumper or cardigan
- White, grey, black, or navy hijab
- Black tights (not see-through)
- Plain black shoes or trainers with no coloured logos

For PE, the kit includes:

- White t-shirt
- · Black or navy joggers or shorts
- Navy jumper
- Plain trainers

Please note that hooded tops are not part of the school uniform and are considered a health and safety hazard during PE. We have made efforts to keep the cost of the uniform low and do not encourage clothing with logos. Second-hand uniforms are available at the school.
