We have made huge improvements with our attendance so far this year. Our first half term was fantastic with a 4% improvement on attendance compared to the same time last year. Unfortunately, this term we have had so many children who have been poorly with this horrible virus/ flu. During last week we had 103 pupils absent on one day due to illness. We hope our families are well recovered and the children are well enough to return to school.

This term we had an Attendance Review visit from BEP (Birmingham Education Partnership). The visit included talking about at how we work with our families to ensure that children are attending school regularly. We looked at how we track school absence and how we aim to improve whole school attendance. This was a really helpful day and we will be meeting with the local authority later this term to gain further support with raising attendance in our school.

Success!!

The local authority now sends us reports on how we compare to similar schools. This half term we have been compared in a group of 21 schools. We ranked 17th out of 21 schools for our school attendance. Although this is still a huge concern, there is improvement - last year we were 21st - the lowest!

Please keep working with us to improve our school attendance. Thank you so much to all our families for bringing their children to school regularly.

Safeguarding and Wellbeing:

Safeguarding & Child Protection is the most important issue for our children and young people.

At Blakesley Hall Primary, we feel it is crucial to work with our parents and the multi agencies that support schools and young people, so that we can offer a safe environment allowing children to be aware of the risks they may face and how to respond to them safely.

Safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children is everyone's responsibility. At Blakesley Hall, we have the attitude of 'it could happen here' where safeguarding is concerned. The well-being and safety of our children is at the very centre of school life.

The Safeguarding Team at Blakesley Hall Primary School

Blakesley Hall safeguarding team has 7 Designated Safeguarding Leads or DSLs. These members of staff have enhanced safeguarding training and have a vital role in taking lead responsibility for child protection issues in school. A DSL is always available during school hours for pupils, parents and staff to discuss any safeguarding concerns.

Our senior DSL is Mrs Smith and she oversees all our safeguarding within school. She is supported by our deputy DSL's Mrs Key, Ms Hack, Mrs Reid-Leonard, Mrs Ramsey, Tina and Nikki.

Often when safeguarding is mentioned, the immediate thought is about child protection - when a child is suffering harm, or is in danger of suffering harm. However, safeguarding is much more complex than this and encompasses a very wide range of areas in all aspects of school. At Blakesley Hall, we ensure that all of our staff are highly trained in all aspects of safeguarding and this training is regularly updated and frequently revisited throughout the year. We also ensure that our curriculum provides the children with age-appropriate opportunities to learn how to keep themselves healthy and safe.

Fundraising



Children in Need:

Reception was the second year group to organise a fundraising event this year. The children and staff worked with the support of the School Council to raise money for Children in Need. As part of the day the children wore spotty clothes and took part in a range of Children in Need activities. We raised over £250 - thank you for your continuing support with our fundraising in school.

Xmas Fayre:

We are thrilled to share that this year's Christmas Fayre was an incredible success! The hall was buzzing with festive cheer. Stalls were packed with gifts, craft activities, delicious treats, and fun games – and lots of children were transformed into reindeer and snowmen at the face –painting stall. A huge thank you to our team of staff elves for making the Christmas Fayre such a fun experience for all the children. We raised over £1800 on the day and are selling the last few treats at 'pop-up' sales after school.
